

Daniel A. Wolf
President, CEO Cape Air Nantucket Airlines

In 1989 Daniel A. Wolf founded Cape Air with one route, Boston to Provincetown, eight employees and a yearly passenger total of 8,000. Under Mr. Wolf's direction Cape Air, along with sister airline Nantucket Airlines, became one of the largest, independent, regional airlines in the United States. The fleet of sixty Cessna 402s and two ATR-42s fly to some of the most beautiful destinations in the world.

Cape Air is an employee-owned company with a workforce of 850 and carries more than 650,000 passengers a year. Cape Air enjoys a codeshare partnership with Continental Airlines, the sixth largest airline in the world, and is the only domestic codeshare partner of JetBlue Airways. In November 2009, Cape Air launched a Mid-west operation with non-stop service between Lambert-St. Louis International Airport and the communities of Quincy and Marion, Illinois and Cape Girardeau, Missouri.

Mr. Wolf's secondary education was at Germantown Friends School in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania followed by a bachelor's degree in Political Philosophy from Wesleyan University in Middletown, Connecticut. At the Quaker School of Aeronautics he received a degree in Airframe and Powerplant Maintenance. Cape Air's maintenance department has been recognized with the prestigious *Diamond Award* by the Federal Aviation Administration for outstanding aircraft maintenance. Mr. Wolf continues to stay current with his airline transport pilot's license and flies a scheduled route in the summer season.

Mr. Wolf serves on a number of boards including the Regional Airline Association, the Department of Conservation and Recreation for the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, the Advisory Council for the Federal Reserve Bank of New England, the Cape Cod Five Cents Savings Bank, The Cape Cod Business Round Table, the Association for the Preservation of Cape Cod, the Housing Assistance Corporation of Cape Cod and the Arts Foundation of Cape Cod. Under Mr. Wolf's leadership the company has received recognition for being one of the most philanthropic companies in southeastern Massachusetts. In addition, Mr. Wolf received the prestigious "*Good Guy*" award from the Massachusetts Women's Political Caucus for his outstanding support of women in the workforce. In 2004 the *Commuter/Regional Airline News* named Dan Wolf, *Turboprop Executive of the Year*.

Mr. Wolf resides in the Cape Cod town of Harwich with his wife, three daughters and an assortment of pets. He enjoys a daily morning bike ride and traveling with his family.
